If you've ever wondered exactly how our scriptures came to be and why the books we recognize as our Old Testament and New Testament canon (meaning: standard or measure), came to be accepted while others books were excluded, this course might be of interest.

Over a six week period Pastor Eric will dig into the primary manuscripts, the scholarship which informs the understanding of scripture, composition and editing, authorship, authority, and controversies which surrounded the formation of canon, and issues facing how we read and understand the nature of scripture today, and how those readings inform and shape our lives and worldviews.

Additionally, we will look into the process of translation, the intrigue and the agendas of translation committees (and individual translations), and how these impact our reading, understanding, and ultimately interpretation and theological points of view.

designated to Family Promise of Wayne County. Their mission is to help homeless and low-income families achieve sustainable independence through a non-governmental, non-denominational community-based response.




Please Pray for Marijana

A dear friend, Marijana, has serious health problems with what she describes as, "dysfunctional kidneys."

She lives with her husband and two teenagers in their home country of Serbia. Carolyn and I enjoyed a good friendship with all four of Marijana's family, as I still do. Carolyn and Marijana were colleagues in an international network, Community Health Evangelism. It is a grass roots community development movement with a particular focus on health (Carolyn) and church leadership, outreach, and mission development (Marijana). There is a history in Marijana's family of Chronic Kidney Disease. She needs a clearer diagnosis, and development of a treatment plan that can be enacted immediately. The Serbian state health system is inadequate for her needs, so she is pursing help from a private clinic. They cannot afford this, I suspect, but neither can they not afford it. Marijana told me, "Well, we are lower class". This stopped me in my tracks because I just don't think of people that way. So sure, on the one hand they don't have a lot of "stuff" like so many of us do, but that's no way to measure a person of course. Marijana graduated from seminary in Croatia where good friends of ours taught. Now she is pursuing a degree in Serbia in psychotherapy. In the face of all the health challenges before her, she remains optimistic and strong in her faith. I invite

On September 23rd we held our Volunteer and Donor Recognition Open House at the Day Center in Lyons. It was nice to visit inperson with those who were able to attend. We sincerely appreciate your continued interest and support, especially over the challenging past year and a half.

The program continues moving forward. The apartment model that we are currently using is changing in exciting ways. We currently have 2 families in the Savannah apartments and one family now in a Lyons apartment. A second family will be moving into another Lyons apartment around October 1st. vanced Atomization Technologies (AA Tech), has been helping to clean up, repair, and prepare these Lyons apartments for our guest families. They are preparing two more apartments in Lyons that are expected to be ready for families in November and December. We are very fortunate to have their support. If you are interested in helping them, call the Day Center and we can connect you with them as they schedule their work days. (Those of you who remember the first family we hosted, Dale, Veronica, and Chris, AA Tech is the company where Dale is employed.) Bringing families to Lyons will not only save money, but allows families easier access to local services and our staff and day center. Our center will be getting more use and will allow for more volunteer interaction with families. We are very excited for this!

Our R.O.T.H. (Roof Over Their Head) program is up and running and helping to keep qualified families in their current housing to prevent loss of home. Our apartment program continues to have a wait list. We ask for prayers for current families in the program while they search for safe and affordable housing. It is a very difficult time to find apartments.

Looking ahead at upcoming events, Family Promise Week is at the end of October. We will also have our winter "Home for the Holidays" auction in mid-November this year. Stay tuned for details!
