Consistory Capsule

Your consistory has been working, through the Executive Committee*, to provide evaluation and guidance to our pastor. These discussions came to a head in July when the consistory asked Bryant Brozik to request that Rochester Classis (the governing body over Reformed churches in our area) dissolve his call to be our minister. After several meetings including representatives of classis, Bryant and consistory came to agreement over terms of severance that will provide financial support to him and his family for a short time while the congregation begins the search for another minister. Bryant, Libby, and Eloise will be moving to an apartment in Palmyra. Libby continues her work for Newark schools, and Bryant intends to seek a call to pastor another congregation. Consistory will continue meeting under supervision of a minister and elder appointed by classis. We will make provision for pulpit supply while we organize to seek a candidate to become our next minister. Your prayerful support will be much appreciated, as will your willingness to participate in the continuing life of our church. Please feel free to call on an elder for guidance or discussion.

The first U.S. Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882 in New York City, planned by the Central Labor Union. The Labor Day parade of about 10,000 workers took unpaid leave and marched from City Hall past Union Square uptown to 42nd street, and ended in Wendel's Elm Park at 92nd Street and 9th Avenue for a concert, speeches, and a picnic.

As PRC is East Palmyra's support church we are reaching out to our congregations and volunteers by asking individuals wanting to help to either purchase some items towards a dinner, or donate money toward a meal (in lieu of preparing a meal or needing to volunteer time). Then groceries will be purchased with the cash and delivered to the families. A few deliveries will be made that week with the groceries to the 3 or 4 families in the program.
