

Just a Tid-Bit of PRC History:

The Memorial Windows

In Memory of Cornelius and Sara Van Hee



Cornelius and Sara (Morell) Van Hee also appear in our 1876 records. His name appears as Trustee on the original Warranty Deed dated 10 February 1872. Sara was a charter member of the Women's Missionary Society organized in 1890 and its first treasurer. When Cornelius died in 1900 he was seventy-two years of age. He had served on the consistory for more than thirty years and when he died the Consistory draped the church in black and placed a memorial to him in their minutes. saving "We are sad

in black and placed a memorial to him in their minutes, saying "We are sad over his loss and are grateful to have had him in our midst for so many years." In our treasurer's records for 1877 there is a gift from Mr. Van Hee's kinderen. One of their sons became a minister in the Reformed Church. Mrs. Van Hee died in 1914 in her 84th year. The emblem in the window is an *Anchor*. This was a Christian symbol used by the first Christians in Rome.



In Memory of Mr. & Mrs. Abram Wisse, Sr., and

Mr. & Mrs. John Robine, Sr.

Abraham and Wilhelmina Leggenaar Wisse (he was born in 1818 and she in 1821 in Holland) also appear in our 1876 records. His name appears elsewhere as Abram Wysee and he was a witness on the original certificate of Incorporation of the church dated 25 February 1867. She died in 1891. He lived into the 20th century, dying in 1901. Their daughter Nellie (who later married Abram Claerbout) was the secretary of the Women's Missionary Society. She also was a charter member, for many years.

Jannes Robyn was born in 1835 and Maria Robyn, born Marien, in 1839. They appear in our earliest membership list of 1876. He lived to 1899 and after his death in 1899 she transferred her membership to the Ontario Reformed Church in 1901. She died in 1918. The emblem on this window is the *Open Bible*, signifying the Word of God.

Entrance Hall

Above the northwest door in the Entrance Hall is simply 1922. This commemorates the year the church was remodeled.

In Memory of Marinus Van Doorn

Marinus Van Doorn served this church as pastor from 1893 to 1905. He was born in the Netherlands in 1842. He was educated at Hope College and New Brunswick Seminary, licensed by the Classis of New Brunswick in 1880 and ordained by the Classis of Geneva in 1881. He Brunswick in 1880 and ordained by the Classis of Geneva in 1881. He was about forty years old when he began his first pastorate. Before he came to Pultneyville he had served Clymer Hill for eight years and Newark, New York, for four years. An excerpt from the Minutes of the Women's Missionary Society, November 9, 1905, reads:



"We regret it being the last meeting with our president (Mrs. Van Doorn). It made us feel very unhappy that we are obliged to bid farewell to our pastor and wife. His ill health being the cause of their departure. We will therefore with a sad courage bid them farewell and with the prayers of us all for a speedy recovery."

Mr. Van Doorn died of cancer in Rochester on October 18, 1910, age sixty-eight years. Ours was his last pastorate. The emblem on this window is the *Crown and Cross*. These symbolize the reward of the faithful in the life after death to those who believe in the crucified Savior. 'Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee the Crown of Life'.
