Bonhoeffer-Discipleship Part 3

We have already considered the two approaches to discipleship which Bonhoeffer deemed not to be discipleship at all. These are following Christ on one's own terms, and following Christ through legalism. There is only one way to respond to the call to discipleship and that is what we will consider in this last installment.

Obedience is the only possible response to Jesus' call to follow. "Follow me, walk behind me." It's not a goal, it's not a program. It's nothing an individual can implement. It's not about what we will get out of it. There are no accolades or grand displays of gratitude. Following Christ is to follow for the "sake of following the call," nothing more nothing less. It is a massive risk. Disciples are called to step out of their previous forms of existing. It means that "former things are left behind." We are to move forward always following Christ, and without all of our expectations and existential baggage in tow. It means living moment by moment with a person was known for speaking in cryptic language and confronting those in power who were steeped in injustice and oppression.

It means that the doing of things as they had been are completely given up. We lose those things which we once clung to as our security in life. We step out from security into "complete insecurity." We step into the unforeseeable and abandon those things that were foreseeable. We step out from this "calculable realm" into one that is incalculable. We step out from the "realm of limited possibilities into the realm of unlimited possibilities." When we enter into such a relationship with the living Christ and when we follow Jesus in this way; then we are following the call of Christ. There is no place to fall in life's path and travails save into his arms should we stumble, as all other things have be left behind in our obedience to the call of Jesus.

The "call to discipleship is a commitment solely to the person of Jesus Christ." Lest we take Bonhoeffer the wrong way here, we should also note that while discipleship is a commitment solely to Christ, it does not mean that Christianity can ever be a "Jesus and me" and that's it proposition. While discipleship links us with Christ alone our Christian vocation (and everyone one of us who are Christ's disciples have one!) arises from that relationship. And this vocation means radical obligation to the Body of Christ (the Church) and unfailing faithful service to the world.



PRC pillowcases, socks, etc. leave hint of God's love

When I tell you that the Oasis conference serves a major role in helping women in hard ministry places continue, I am not exaggerating.

This year's team from PRC not only encouraged the 50 women who attended, but also put a new step of joy into the hearts of the five Croatia-side steering committee members, some of whom were about ready to throw in the towel on the whole enterprise.

We heard comments like, "I had thought maybe this conference had outlived its purpose," and then, "Oasis was resurrected!" The latter a tearful admission that something they longed for had returned.

This was from the women who work hard behind the scenes to organize the facility, speakers, and program. They had become weary with the many details. But, our group, ready to serve them as well as the others, helped re-invigorate them. Now they can continue the Oasis conference for the benefit of ministry work in Croatia for years to come.

That's what your support of this mission has done for women ministering in and around Croatia.

You have and will continue to hear from our women about those they met, ministered to, and were inspired by. They want to tell their stories, and I hope you want to hear them. The experience was an exhausting but rich one for them all.

From my position as the leader of the PRC team, I can tell you God's hand was in it from beginning to end! Even the upsetting disruption in our flights couldn't dampen the resolve of our women.

Amy Burdett did yeoman's work by staying in contact with our travel agent and Delta/KLM — hours upon hours on the phone! — to make sure the team could get beyond Amsterdam and into Croatia.

Even when we ended up 250 miles from where we wanted to go, in Zagreb, the capital, rather than the seaside of Split, Amy stepped up, with a truly joyful servant's heart, to drive the van. That drive took another seven hours of traveling — after the team had been moving for more than 31 hours!

Yeah, it was rough. The return was also brutal as we had to give up our last night in the hotel and instead made a long day of traveling the coast to get back to Zagreb for a 5:45 a.m. flight. International check-in requirements meant we could not get a hotel in Zagreb either. So, the return trek was literally 44 hours in duration!

But that aside, our women are full of joy themselves in what God did through them, in thankfulness for getting to meet such wonderful servants of Christ, and for the chance to represent you on mission.

One of the surprise God-encounters for me was a connection Valerie and I made with a former student. We had arranged for Daniel Vuga and his wife, Marijana, to drive us from our planned arrival in Zagreb east to Osijek, where we spent a few days before the team arrived. I wanted to learn more about the Vugas' work with the homeless in the capital city. Then Marijana herself was able to be a guest of ours at the conference, something desperately needed after her years of constant 15-hour days! She was thrilled with the many homemade touches of love prepared by our congregation and drank in the fellowship with other servants of God working in her country.

Yes, you should be so proud of your Oasis Team!!



Family Promise Update

Family Promise of Wayne County continues to be in great demand of services provided. There are currently 28 families on the waiting list to enter the temporary housing/apartment program. The ROTH Program also continues to be in demand with record numbers of inquiries coming in each week.

We celebrate a graduation on November 1st! Sam and his four children have been in the program for eight months. This is a significant period of time. He was ready well within the normal 90-120 day "limit" the program was designed for but his obstacle was finding an affordable and safe place that could accommodate his family. Sam currently resides in one of the apartments that we rent from landlord Sean Dobbins. Sean has been very impressed with Sam and his upkeep of the apartment during his stay. Sean recently found out that he would have a rental unit becoming available that was large enough for Sam's family and notified Sam and FPWC. Sean really wanted to keep Sam as a tenant based on the past eight months and so Sam and his family will be moving in next week! Congratulations to Sam for all of his hard work and thank you to Sean for supporting Family Promise and our families!
