Lenten House Blessings

This practice may be unfamiliar to many of you. It is a practice in many churches (especially Catholic, Orthodox, and Anglican) for the minister to go around to houses during the Lenten season to bless houses and/ or businesses of parishioners. We do this in recognition that God came to dwell with us and to be a blessing in our lives. The places where we dwell are a big part of our lives.

My visit to your house can be as brief as you would like, and I'm not there to take a tour of your home to discover your secrets. I'm simply there to pray for you, your family, and your place of dwelling (or if you prefer business). I usually will anoint the entryway of your home, and you as well. I do this using an anoint ng brush that I made (a practice among the Orthodox), along with anointing oil which has been deeply prayed over and had the four Gospels read during the three day preparation cycle. The anointing oil comes from the most ancient formula's I could find, again from Orthodox tradition, and did my best to reconstruct. I will be testing for Covid prior to the visits and will also where a mask at your request. Who knows what this virus will bring?!

The visits will begin Saturdays, February 25th, and continue through March 11th, and will be offered at 9am and 10:00, 12:00. Sign up in Trinity Hall, email or call the church office.

Prayer to open eyes, hearts to the needs of Muslims

A prayer project that has undergirded a massive movement to Christ over the last 30 years is again being offered to our congregation in the 30 Days Prayer for the Muslim World.

The project coincides intentionally but respectfully with Ramadan, the important month of fasting when Muslims themselves seek God. It began in 1993 in the Middle East when some Christians got together and decided to actually *pray* for their Muslim neighbors. Since then, millions of Christians have joined in the prayer effort, learning more about followers of Islam and opening their heart to see them as God sees them.

Since the project began, more Muslims have come to Christ than in the 14 centuries before. And breakthroughs are happening all over, in closed countries and open ones as the message of the gospel is penetrating darkness.

In addition to booklets with daily information to help us learn about the many different peoples who call themselves Muslim — they are not all Arabs! — we will be prompted to pray for specific areas and needs.

The month culminates in the Night of Power, to be observed generally on April 17. This is a time when many followers of Islam are particularly focused on asking God to speak to them.

To prepare our hearts for that important night, the Missions Committee is planning a special event set for **Sunday**, **April 16**. Watch for details on the Missions bulletin board, in the weekly bulletin, and here.

While you are at the Missions bulletin board, check out the article on **Danijel and Marijana Vuga**. Danijel is a former student of Pastor Eric and mine at the seminary where we served for six years. His wife, Marijana, was a special guest of ours at the Oasis women's retreat. Diana Lagoner, who got to know Marijana as her small group leader, spoke at our Harvest Dinner of how Marijana was blessed by the retreat.

The couple was included in a *Balkan Insight* article entitled "Heroes of 2022: People Who Made a Difference." *Balkan Insight* is flagship English-language website with daily news, analysis, and investigative reporting on key issues in a 10-country region of the Balkans.

The article cites data from the Croatian Network for the Homeless that there are 2,000 people in Zagreb that sleep on the streets with nothing and 10,000 more who have some kind of shelter or shanty but no real income.

The Vugas were cited for providing services to the homeless that until recently was not available elsewhere, such as a place to get a shower or wash clothes in addition to help getting health insurance or a job.

PRC sent \$2,600 to help in their work: \$1500 from funds left over from the Croatia Mission trip and year-end giving and another \$1,100 raised by the congregation in the January communion offering.

The church also sent \$1,500 to Marijana Čizmanski, another former student who was our guest at the Oasis conference. She runs a Community Health Evangelism ministry to Roma called Zdrava Zajednica or ZZ Serbia. The funds came from left over Croatia trip funds and year end giving. Marijana's ministry is set to be our communion offering in July.
