

# PRC Connections - September 2022 Rev. Eric Titus What's the Reformed Church in America's Position On....

You may have had people ask you: "what's the Reformed Church's position on...." You may not know the answer to a question like that on a number of issues of social importance. There is a reason behind this.

The Reformed Church's constitution has three parts: The Book of Church Order, our Standards (Heidelberg Catechism, Belgic Confession, Belhar Confession, and the Canons of Dort), and finally our Liturgy. *Only liturgies having to do with sacraments are included in this last part*. So, our baptismal liturgy is part of the constitution while our liturgies for marriage and funerals are not.

What is significant here is that our *constitution is binding* on all office-holders in the RCA (Ministers of Word and Sacrament, Elders, and Deacons) and all assemblies in the RCA (consistories, classes, regional synods, and General Synod). What is not binding are statements or declarations of assemblies. Statements and declarations may be witnesses, exhortations, admonitions, or proclamations, but one thing is certain, they are not binding on office-holders or assemblies. We have a non-hierarchical polity and government that allows and is in fact built to make room for a wide diversity within the bounds of our constitution.

Scripture plays the ultimate role in this. And it is incumbent upon office-holders and assemblies to wrestle with scripture within constitutional bounds. Note, this means that scriptural interpretation is not a matter of individual whim, but is itself held within the bounds of constitution (not scripture, but scriptural interpretation). This means that assemblies, and especially our national assembly cannot declare for the entire denomination what the scripture definitely says about X, Y, or Z. The General Synod would then become a "papal assembly." Furthermore, it would mean that General Synod one year could render an interpretation and then the next year the General Synod could render precisely the opposite interpretation since it is a representative body whose delegates change each year. You can see that chaos and confusion are likely outcomes of this.

This is why the General Synod cannot deliver a categorical statement on any given issue. We work rather toward common understandings and therefore can truly live into our motto: Reformed and always reforming.

The answer to the question "what's the RCA's position on..." really does become one of: "as many positions as there are Christians," so long as that position does not find itself in conflict with the constitution of the RCA. This does not mean the positions can't be challenged. We have another process for that, and through our long history many positions have been challenged and those holding them held accountable when found wanting in their understanding of a particular point of scriptural interpretation. This happens through our judiciary process, but that is another article unto itself.

# PRC Team seeks to bless their socks on at conference

Fun is part of the ministry we seek to take to the weary women missionaries in Croatia later this month, and we plan to start out by giving them games and, yes, actual socks.

Not just any socks, though. We want soft, fuzzy socks that have been prayed over.

Seem a little strange?

Well, both Isaiah and Paul link feet and the idea of taking the gospel and proclaiming peace. Isaiah tells us "how beautiful on the mountains" are these feet, and Paul's description of the armor of God includes gospel-of-peace foot coverings. The women missionaries we are going to serve have left their homeland to take the good news to people in and around Croatia, and we want their actual feet to feel some of the comfort and love from our congregation.

So, we are asking you to help us collect 60 pairs of such soft, fuzzy socks and to pray for each woman who receives them to know that God sees her feet and doesn't want them to stumble as she continues to serve the Lord right where she is.

You can leave the socks in the basket at the mission table.

We will use the socks in a fun, ice- breaker game and then have the women keep a pair to cuddle in and to be reminded that God cares for them.

I think it will be the first of the things we do that will "bless their socks on!"

Don't be fooled by the "silliness" of blessed socks or the beautiful resort setting on the stunning Croatian coast as the ministry to the women at the conference is real! Many, like myself when I was a full-time missionary in Croatia, arrive down-hearted, discouraged, and wondering if they can continue for another year in ministry. The toll of the constant spiritual oppression on them and their families is staggering. That is why the women themselves named the conference *Oasis* because it is a place for rest, relaxation, rehydration, and renewal for women who often feel like they are in a dry desert.

As we enter the final weeks of our preparation for the trip, we are focusing ourselves on prayer for the team as well as for the missionaries we encounter. We ask for concerted prayer from you as well.

For the team, we ask you to pray for our safety in traveling, for the unity among our members, and for each of us to be good listeners and encouragers to the women we meet.

For the missionaries attending, we ask for prayer that they would be renewed in their faith, encouraged in their ministry and that they would connect with others to find answers to basic living questions they may not even know they have yet.


#### Fall Bible Study

Our tendency is to think of stewardship primarily in financial terms--- "What do I owe? ----but money is only one of the gifts God gives us to manage. We'll also reflect on how we can use the gift of time, the gift of the creation itself, and the gift of God's grace in thankfulness to God.


