Ex Oriente lux!

From the East light! Lights are a huge part of Christmas. Some houses are encumbered with so many lights one wonders how it is that they do not collapse under the weight. The amount of electric energy needed to power these is staggering. Yet, for all of this light it can be remarkably dark at Christmas. This is not only because we live almost daily with a rise in violence and hate; it is because we have over the years replaced light from the East with commercialism of the West. I think the number of lights, yard balloons and decorations is an attempt to fill a void, but this attempt is like trying to replace the sun with a 100-watt bulb. The lights on display at Christmas have little meaning to many people who put them out, other than to manufacture in human terms a good will that only God can give (Luke 2:14).

Christmas is a wonderful time. But it can only reach so far if we follow only lights to the nearest store or the light of our computer screen to the next website for must-have Christmas bargains. This is to make the mistake of taking the light from the East and replacing it with Western lights. The Feast of the Nativity of Christ is robbed of its rightful place and our darkness only becomes more isolating.

Our lives long for a specific light—the one that ushers our lives out of darkness into the light of life. But we must be clear here. This is not just any light that we plug in, light up, or switch on. It is not a light that leaves us empty like our bank accounts the day after Christmas. No this light, the one that brought all life into being, is a light that overtakes our hearts, claims our lives, and drives darkness out.

This light is the *ex Oriente lux*, a light that comes as the Feast of the Nativity. There are sign-posts that lead us to this light, like the star from the East. John the Baptist is himself called a witness to the light. The beautiful hymn of the Virgin Mary, which we call the *Magnificat*, and Mary herself in whose womb the light was carried are all signs of the one light for which humanity yearns.

Magi and shepherds came because of such a light. Both the magi and shepherds proclaimed ex Oriente lux! A star standing out in the darkness: fierce, relentless, unyielding and unswayed by the darkness surrounding it. This light from the East sparked the light of hope in all of them. The star alone could not do this. The star was only a promise that another light was coming from the East. This light was life itself (John 1:4-5).

Let our proclamation be as witnesses to the light. Then with the star, the magi, the shepherds, Mary and John we can "Go Tell it On the Mountain, that Jesus Christ is born." Behold, ex Oriente lux!


